A quorum being present, Director Gans called the meeting to order and announced the Board of Directors meeting to be in session for the transaction of any and all business to be brought before it at this time.

2	7:00 P.M.
3	DIRECTOR GANS: Call to order the
4	Open Meeting of the Monarch Fire Protection
5	District Board of Directors.
6	Would you please rise and join me in
7	the Pledge of Allegiance?
8	(Whereupon, all persons joined in reciting
9	the Pledge of Allegiance, and the following
10	proceedings were had.)
11	DIRECTOR GANS: Approval of Agenda.
12	Are there any changes to the Agenda?
13	DIRECTOR MILLNER: I have none.
14	DIRECTOR HARRIS: I have none.
15	DIRECTOR GANS: I have none.
16	Chief?
17	CHIEF SPIEGEL: Yes, sir. I would
18	like to postpone item C., until later.
19	DIRECTOR GANS: Okay. We will remove
20	item 8-C from the agenda, tonight.
21	Any other changes?
22	DIRECTOR MILLNER: No.
23	DIRECTOR GANS: All right, hearing
24	none, we're going to move to Citizen Comments.
25	Seeing no citizens, there'll be no

- 1 Citizen Comments.
- And, with that, we move to the
- 3 President's Report.
- I want to mention something that I
- 5 haven't actually talked about in years. Many
- 6 years.
- And, on one hand, it's not something
- 8 I ever like to talk about, but, it -- it's what
- 9 we do.
- I was monitoring a call, I believe,
- on the Fourth of July. A house fire in West
- 12 County's District.
- 13 This was during a line of storms
- 14 that moved through and created a large call
- volume and we know, when we have a large call
- 16 volume, we end up doing a lot of mutual aid, in
- 17 and out.
- The result of that was 2202 had
- 19 command of a fairly significant house fire in
- 20 West County's District. I won't name what the
- 21 subdivision was, but, -- and it'd been a while,
- 22 but I listened to the call and it was a two alarm
- 23 call, with a lengthy period of fire suppression.
- 24 And I want to commend Battalion
- 25 Chief Fassler for a job well done.

- 1 You commanded the scene. I was
- 2 hearing all the "com's" I was mainly listening to
- 3 the main channel, not the tech channels and you
- 4 had a lot going on, a lot of equipment; those
- 5 aren't particularly small lots, but there's
- 6 limited space to work with what you had.
- 7 And you had a pretty long event.
- 8 So I hope that West County
- 9 appreciated the job that you did and I appreciate
- 10 the job you did. A job well done.
- 11 So, thank you.
- 12 (Generous applause.)
- DIRECTOR GANS: And that concludes
- 14 the President's Report.
- On to the Secretary's Report.
- DIRECTOR MILLNER: Alrighty.
- 17 (Inaudible)
- I have a few Minutes that need
- 19 approval.
- I would like to move for the
- 21 approval of the Open Meeting Minutes for July 12,
- 22 2018 and July 18, 2018.
- DIRECTOR GANS: I will second the
- 24 motion.
- 25 Any discussion?

1	(No response.)
2	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
3	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
4	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
5	DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
6	Motion passes three to nothing.
7	DIRECTOR MILLNER: I also move for
8	the approval of the Closed Meeting Minutes from
9	July 12, 2018 and July 18, 2018.
10	DIRECTOR GANS: I will second the
11	motion.
12	Any discussion?
13	DIRECTOR MILLNER: No.
14	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
15	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
16	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
17	DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
18	Motion passes three to nothing.
19	DIRECTOR MILLNER: And, that con-
20	cludes the Secretary's Report.
21	DIRECTOR GANS: Okay.
22	Moving on to the Treasurer's Report.
23	DIRECTOR HARRIS: We have disburse-
24	ments in the amount of \$422,649.20 for the
25	period.

- We have seven checks over \$5,000.00.
- 2 Check number 41483 to Ameren
- 3 Missouri for utilities and it looks like, at
- 4 least, the training tower was cheap.
- 5 DIRECTOR GANS: It wasn't cheap on
- 6 water.
- 7 (General laughter.)
- B DIRECTOR GANS: If you look at
- 9 bill.
- They've gotta stop using so much
- 11 water there.
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: Check number 41497
- 13 to Don Brown.
- 14 That, I believe, is a dealership.
- 15 Is that not correct?
- 16 CHIEF SPIEGEL: Yes, sir.
- 17 DIRECTOR HARRIS: And that would be
- 18 for three replacement staff vehicles.
- 19 And I want to point out that, in
- 20 fact, those were part of our budget and done
- 21 without bond money, as we have been doing for the
- 22 time I've been on the Board.
- Our staff vehicles come out of just
- 24 our standard operating budget.
- 25 CHIEF SPIEGEL: That's correct.

- 1 DIRECTOR HARRIS: Check number
- 2 41516.
- 3 Pardon me. I believe I left out the
- 4 amount. That was for the Don Brown for three
- 5 staff vehicles; \$108,237.00 and no cents.
- 6 Check number 41516 to Mediclaims, in
- 7 the amount of \$8,246.54.
- 8 That would be for the June billing.
- 9 Check number 41521 to Ogletree,
- 10 Deakins, Nash, Smoak & Stewart, in the amount of
- 11 \$12,219.00 and no cents.
- 12 That is a June billing for legal
- 13 expenses.
- 14 Check number 41525 to Public Safety
- 15 Upfitters in the amount of \$31,665.00 and no
- 16 cents.
- 17 That is for the specialized safety
- 18 equipment for our three new staff vehicles.
- I believe, life packages and some
- 20 other --
- DIRECTOR GANS: Which the Board has
- 22 gotten to see.
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: Yes.
- DIRECTOR MILLNER: That's pretty
- 25 cool.

1	DIRECTOR HARRIS: And, actually, as
2	we all know, probably the highest risk to first
3	responders, that in the current era is traffic.
4	And so making sure those vehicles
5	are high-viz, along with our apparatus, I think
6	that new paint scheme will make our trucks and
7	ambulances higher viability.
8	
9 -	Sorry.
10	It's an inside joke, over that paint
11	scheme, but
12	Check number 41542, to United Health
13	Care in the amount of \$188,482.82.
14	And that is for the August billing
15	for health care.
16	Check number 41543 to UNUM in the
17	amount of \$11,737.46.
18	That is for June and July billing.
19	(Static.)
20	DIRECTOR GANS: Disability?
21	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Yes.
22	DIRECTOR GANS: All right. And
23	that would (static) pardon me.
24	DIRECTOR HARRIS: I'm sure that is.
25	Are there any questions?

- 1 DIRECTOR GANS: As a matter of
- fact, I did send some questions to Michelle and
- 3 the chief.
- 4 And they were satisfactorily
- 5 answered.
- I do note that it was the roughest
- 7 time period for air conditioning units I've ever
- 8 seen.
- 9 I'm not sure we didn't replace 2237
- 10 with the --
- 11 CHIEF SPIEGEL: We did.
- 12 DIRECTOR GANS: -- cost of the air
- 13 conditioning.
- 14 There -- there were significant
- 15 bills for that. We all know that we had a very
- 16 hot May and June and we all had big electric
- 17 bills and the Fire District ended up with some
- 18 large air conditioning repair bills for its
- 19 ambulances.
- But, of course, we run calls for
- 21 everything and having a cool ambulance is
- 22 important.
- 23 So we should have cool ambulances.
- Other than that, all the questions
- were satisfactorily answered. That one was, as

- 1 well.
- So I have no further questions.
- 3 DIRECTOR MILLNER: I have no
- 4 questions.
- 5 DIRECTOR HARRIS: And those were all
- 6 answered satisfactorily.
- 7 I did have just a request, along
- 8 those lines.
- 9 Would you have our maintenance
- 10 personnel provide, to the Board, a list with the
- 11 year we acquired -- not the apparatus,
- 12 ambulances, but the units in the Houses and in
- 13 Headquarters, so we have sort of a broad overview
- of where we are on the air conditioning units
- that provide for our actual facilities?
- It is something -- I know we've been
- in a process of upgrading and that may actually
- 18 be something we're going to bring up in our
- 19 budget meetings.
- But, just them if they could;
- 21 there's not a rush, in the next couple of weeks,
- 22 generate that.
- 23 There shouldn't be having -- there
- 24 shouldn't be that many units.
- 25 CHIEF SPIEGEL: You're talking about

- 1 the HVC's in the --
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: Yeah.
- 3 CHIEF SPIEGEL: Okay. I'll see what
- 4 I can come up with.
- 5 And, previously, our practice has
- 6 been to budget a replacement per year, out of
- 7 greed..
- 8 And that's -- that's been a
- 9 successful practice.
- 10 DIRECTOR HARRIS: Yeah, I -- I mean,
- I have seen that, I think every year I've been on
- the Board, we're replacing at least one.
- But, just trying to -- because, it
- 14 -- it came to the forefront because of the high
- 15 costs in a -- in this check run.
- 16 CHIEF SPIEGEL: I'll do it.
- 17 DIRECTOR HARRIS: In that case, in
- 18 reviewing these disbursements, they appear to be
- 19 reasonable and necessary in the conduct of the
- 20 District's business.
- 21 Chief Spiegel, were these checks
- 22 prepared per your recommendation?
- 23 CHIEF SPIEGEL: Yes, they were.
- 24 DIRECTOR HARRIS: Do they violate
- 25 any state bidding statutes, or constitute

1	installment payments?
2	CHIEF SPIEGEL: None that I'm aware
3	of.
4	DIRECTOR HARRIS: I make a motion
5	that we accept the disbursements as prepared.
6	DIRECTOR GANS: I will second the
7	motion.
8	Any discussion?
9	DIRECTOR MILLNER: No.
10	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
11	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
12	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
13	DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
14	Motion passes three to nothing.
15	DIRECTOR HARRIS: And is often my
16	habit, just a quick comment.
17	While today is July 25th, in fact
18	this coming Friday will mark the end, once again,
19	of the Korean War, one which most people tend to
20	forget, which cost a number of Americans their
21	lives and saw some of the, well, heroic acts that
22	were on par with anything in any war or conflict.
23	And, also, on Friday, the 27th is the
24	anniversary of the death of Bob Hope. And that's
25	actually kind of linked, because while he lived

- 1 to the age of 100, he did, I believe, over 50
- 2 movies and untold visits to military facilities
- 3 providing entertainment and support.
- 4 And that completes the Treasurer's
- 5 Report.
- 6 DIRECTOR GANS: Thank you.
- 7 Moving on to the Chief's Report.
- 8 CHIEF SPIEGEL: Yes, sir. Item A.,
- 9 on -- on my agenda is -- we postponed the fire
- 10 alarm system upgrades, pending a review by the
- 11 attorney.
- 12 And Matt has weighed in on that and
- 13 (inaudible due to coughing) get those approved.
- 14 DIRECTOR GANS: Matt, --
- 15 MISTER HOFFMAN: Yes, sir.
- DIRECTOR GANS: -- we're not on the
- 17 Attorney's Report, but do you have anything to
- 18 report on this?
- 19 MISTER HOFFMAN: Well, I would say
- 20 that on -- on each one, we want to make a
- 21 separate motion.
- 22 DIRECTOR GANS: Okay.
- 23 MISTER HOFFMAN: I've reviewed each
- 24 document and the prices are -- are different, but
- 25 similar pricing on each one.

1	So I would do a different motion for
2	each property.
3	DIRECTOR GANS: Okay. And you've
4	reviewed the contracts and they're acceptable?
5	MISTER HOFFMAN: Yes, sir.
6	DIRECTOR GANS: Thank you.
7	At this time, I will make a motion
8	to accept the bid from Tech Electronics for fire
9	fire protection, a fire alarm system upgrades
10	for the Administrative Building in the amount of
11	\$29,419.00 and no cents.
12	Do I hear a second?
13	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Second.
14	DIRECTOR GANS: Any discussion?
15	DIRECTOR MILLNER: No.
16	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
17	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
18	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
19	DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
20	Motion passes three to nothing.
21	I make a motion to accept the bid
22	from Tech Electronics for fire alarm upgrades for
23	the Maintenance Building in the amount of
24	\$17,694.00 and no cents.
25	Do I hear a second?

1	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Second.
2	DIRECTOR GANS: Discussion?
3	(No response.)
4	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
5	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
6	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
7	DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
8	Motion passes three to nothing.
9	And, finally, I make a motion to
10	accept the bid from Tech Electronics for fire
11	alarm upgrades to Station House Number Five, in
12	the amount of \$21,550.00 and no cents.
13	Do I hear a second?
14	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Second.
15	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
16	Or, is there a discussion?
17	DIRECTOR MILLNER: No.
18	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
19	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
20	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
21	DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
22	Motion passes three to nothing.
23	CHIEF SPIEGEL: Thank you.
24	DIRECTOR GANS: Hm-hm.
25	CHIEF SPIEGEL: Well, item B, some

- 1 -- a couple of meetings ago I had asked the Board
- 2 to consider allowing a third party contract lawn
- 3 care, so we could relieve Randy of some duties.
- The properties are demanding, time
- 5 demanding and -- and intense labor demanding.
- So, we have done that. We have
- 7 received quotes from several lawn care.
- 8 The low bid was Wells Lawn Care.
- 9 Their bid came in at \$456.00 per
- week, estimated to complete 2018 would be about
- \$5,400.00.
- 12 So I would like to make a
- 13 recommendation that we hire Wells, pending that
- 14 they have work health insurance and liability
- 15 insurance.
- And they have claimed they have the
- 17 -- we have not received that, yet, but they claim
- 18 that they have that.
- 19 DIRECTOR GANS: Is that something
- 20 we need to vote on?
- 21 MISTER HOFFMAN: Yes. I would vote
- 22 on any -- their service, so you -- I guess you
- 23 don't technically have to, but because there were
- 24 multiple bidders, I think it's a good idea to --
- 25 to make a motion and approve.

- But, I would do the motion subject
- 2 to receipt -- those insurance documents.
- 3 DIRECTOR GANS: Right.
- And this is not under contract, so
- 5 this is -- all right.
- 6 CHIEF SPIEGEL: And I would like, if
- 7 it -- if it -- if it plays out well, that might
- 8 be something we would entertain on 2019's budget.
- And then we would go out to bid.
- 10 Because there were several companies
- 11 interested in the business.
- 12 DIRECTOR GANS: All right. Is
- 13 there any -- do we have any relationship with
- 14 this company?
- 15 CHIEF SPIEGEL: We do not.
- 16 DIRECTOR GANS: Okay.
- 17 Then I will make a motion to engage
- 18 the services of Wells Landscaping for landscape
- 19 -- for grass cutting and landscaping?
- 20 CHIEF SPIEGEL: Wells Lawn Service.
- DIRECTOR GANS: Wells Lawn Service.
- 22 And this is for grass cutting only?
- 23 CHIEF SPIEGEL: Grass cutting,
- 24 trimming and cleanup.
- DIRECTOR GANS: Grass cutting.

1 Grass cutting, trimming and cleanup.
2 CHIEF SPIEGEL: And that's for all

-- all properties.

3

- 4 DIRECTOR GANS: For all properties,
- in the amount of \$456.00 a week, subject to the
- 6 receipt of all required documentation of
- 7 insurance and related matters on a need -- on a
- 8 as-needed bases at the chief's discretion.
- 9 Do I hear a second?
- 10 DIRECTOR MILLNER: Second.
- 11 DIRECTOR GANS: Discussion?
- 12 DIRECTOR MILLNER: No.
- DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
- 14 DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
- 16 DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
- Motion passes.
- 18 CHIEF SPIEGEL: Thank you.
- 19 That concludes my report.
- 20 DIRECTOR GANS: All right.
- 21 Attorney's Report?
- 22 MISTER HOFFMAN: I -- I do not have
- anything else, this evening.
- 24 DIRECTOR GANS: Well, thank you for
- 25 the report you gave us, though.

- 1 (General chuckles.)
- DIRECTOR GANS: That takes us to
- 3 New Business.
- 4 The Board has had a discussion about
- 5 Meeting dates, which we wish to announce now in
- 6 a public meeting.
- 7 We are going to hold a Closed
- 8 session on August 1st at 5:30 P.M.
- 9 There'll be an Open session at Seven
- 10 P.M., on August  $9^{th}$ .
- We then have two unusual times on
- 12 the next two.
- There will be an Open Meeting on
- 14 August 13<sup>th</sup> at Nine A.M.
- 15 Finally, there'll be a Closed
- 16 Meeting on August 24th at Ten A.M.
- 17 That brings me to budget workshops.
- 18 The Board needs to begin addressing that.
- As I look at this schedule, the only
- 20 dates we'd probably be able to possibly do it
- 21 would be the  $1^{st}$ , or the  $8^{th}$ .
- 22 And I'm not even consulting the
- Board before I consult the head-shaking Michelle,
- 24 who --
- 25 (General laughter.)

- 1 DIRECTOR GANS: -- me telling
- 2 that, I expected that.
- 3 So we will take up budget
- 4 discussions and we'll have to move through them
- 5 rapidly in September.
- MS. DEPEW: Absolutely.
- 7 DIRECTOR GANS: Certainly nothing
- 8 wrong with sending out information to us in
- 9 advance for us to mull over what there is.
- But, when we set the September
- dates, they will include at least one, if not two
- 12 budget workshops.
- 13 (Severe static)
- DIRECTOR GANS: Okay. Any other
- 15 New Business?
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: We don't really
- 17 need to.
- DIRECTOR GANS: That's true.
- 19 (Severe static)
- DIRECTOR GANS: We're going to move
- on to any other New Business.
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: Actually, I just
- 23 wanted to make a -- a quick comment.
- Would you please put out information
- 25 to the Board when you are ready, so we -- we can

- 1 find dates.
- I may try to come in, when you --
- 3 once you get your broad, or more pointed
- 4 overview, I -- I may still try to come by and
- 5 just meet with the chief and our controller to
- 6 take a quick look --
- 7 (Severe static.)
- 8 DIRECTOR GANS: (inaudible)
- 9 DIRECTOR HARRIS: -- so we would
- 10 appreciate knowing when you're ready.
- I realize, not -- not the final,
- 12 budget, just when you're ready at a point where
- 13 we could hold a discussion.
- 14 TECHNICIAN: Excuse me. I think I've
- 15 -- I've tried to maybe hear a little bit of that
- 16 noise.
- 17 Could you guys mute your mic's?
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: We'll go into
- 19 recess.
- DIRECTOR GANS: We're going to take
- 21 a brief recess. We're off the record.
- We'll all mute our mic's now.
- 23 (Whereupon, at 7:18 P.M., the Board went
- off the record and returned on the record at 7:19
- P.M., as follows.)

- CHIEF SPIEGEL: (not recorded) a

  conversation with -
  DIRECTOR HARRIS: I heard it, too.
- 4 DIRECTOR GANS: Call back to order
- 5 the Open Meeting of the Monarch Fire Protection
- 6 District Board of Directors.
- 7 Robin, have you finished what you
- 8 were saying?
- 9 DIRECTOR HARRIS: I have. Thank
- 10 you.
- 11 DIRECTOR GANS: Okay.
- 12 CHIEF SPIEGEL: As we draft these --
- these pending budgets, we'll copy the Board.
- And, certainly, you're invited to
- any of the staff meetings.
- DIRECTOR HARRIS: Thanks.
- DIRECTOR GANS: So, I guess, you do
- 18 have one other item.
- 19 Central County meets once a month.
- I will be out of the country on August 22<sup>nd</sup>, which
- 21 is their next scheduled meeting.
- There are months they don't meet.
- They generally meet every month, but
- every once in a while there's not enough on the
- 25 agenda.

- 1 We went in tonight, not sure if
- 2 there was a meeting and I ended up having to
- 3 leave the meeting before it was over, there was
- 4 so much.
- 5 And that doesn't mean you'd be there
- 6 for hours. We started at five and I left at
- 7 6:20.
- 8 So, I need someone to attend in my
- 9 place on August 22<sup>nd</sup> at five o'clock.
- 10 DIRECTOR MILLNER: That'll be fine.
- 11 I should be able to do that.
- 12 DIRECTOR GANS: Okay. I think
- 13 that's --
- 14 DIRECTOR MILLNER: (not audible due
- 15 to cross talk.)
- DIRECTOR GANS: That'll be good for
- 17 you to go do that.
- 18 Cary and Les, I'd ask one of you
- 19 also to go.
- 20 (More cross talk.)
- DIRECTOR GANS: Jean, you'll find
- 22 -- you'll find that helpful. They're, you know,
- 23 kind of a walk-through with it.
- 24 DIRECTOR MILLNER: That's August
- $25 22^{nd}$ .

1	DIRECTOR GANS: Yes.
2	So, Jean will attend as our rep.
3	Cary, would you check into what we
4	need to do to make that allowable.
5	I think we're we now have listed
6	Robin as the alternate.
7	You'll be on that, but we can change
8	that up for this.
9	CHIEF SPIEGEL: We'll make those
10	corrections.
11	DIRECTOR GANS: Okay.
12	DIRECTOR HARRIS: I'm not available
13	<b></b> .
14	DIRECTOR GANS: Okay.
15	DIRECTOR HARRIS: $$ on the $22^{nd}$ .
16	DIRECTOR GANS: All right.
17	So, any other New Business?
18	(No response.)
19	DIRECTOR GANS: Any Unfinished
20	Business?
21	(No response.)
22	DIRECTOR GANS: Does anyone have a
23	need for a Closed Meeting?
24	(No response.)
25	DIRECTOR GANS: Hear hearing

1.	none, I make a motion to adjourn.
2	DIRECTOR MILLNER: I'll second.
3	DIRECTOR GANS: Discussion?
4	(No response.)
5	DIRECTOR GANS: All in favor?
6	DIRECTOR MILLNER: Aye.
7	DIRECTOR HARRIS: Aye.
8	DIRECTOR GANS: Aye.
9	Motion passes three to nothing.
10	We're adjourned and off the record.
